## Important Facts:

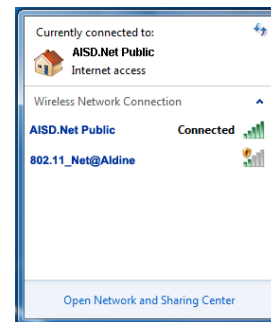
- Users of the Aldine ISD Public Wi-Fi network have filtered Internet access in compliance with CIPA regulations.
- Aldine ISD offers many educational resources via the Internet, therefore extending learning beyond the classroom.
- Students from grades 2-12 may now bring their own technology devices (laptop, cell phone, tablet, etc.) to Aldine ISD campuses to be utilized in the classroom at the discretion of the teacher.
- By connecting to the Aldine Public Wi-Fi, users accept the terms of the Acceptable Use Policy located on the Aldine ISD Website.
- Use of personal technology within the district is a privilege and not a right.
- Students are expected to exhibit digital citizenship by following the Acceptable Use Policy while using technology.

## Bring Your Own Technology (BYOT):



- Aldine ISD is now offering a filtered Public Wi-Fi in selected areas of campuses (AISD.net Public).
- Students on campuses may bring a personal device to school and use for educational purposes.
- Students are expected to connect to the filtered Aldine Public-Wi-Fi to ensure access to the best online resources.



<b>Responsibility for Technology:</b>	<b>Responsible Use of Technology:</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Students are solely responsible for the personal technology device that is brought to school.</li> <li>● The campus or district assumes no responsibility for personal devices if they are lost, loaned, damaged, or stolen.</li> <li>● Personal devices may be subject to investigation in accordance with District Policy.</li> <li>● Students are to keep their devices secure at all times and not loan to others.</li> <li>● Students must keep devices turned off, on silent, or vibrate mode as defined by teacher.</li> </ul>	<p>Look for more information from designated campuses regarding important guidelines to share with your child about Digital Citizenship.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Use strong passwords</li> <li>● Do not share passwords</li> <li>● Keep addresses, phone numbers, and other personal Information private</li> <li>● Be respectful when communicating</li> <li>● Do not connect with people you do not know personally</li> <li>● Students are expected to connect to the filtered Aldine Public Wi-Fi while on campus</li> <li>● Report any suspicious information to a teacher or campus administrator immediately</li> <li>● Photos/Videos are to be taken only when directed by the classroom teacher</li> <li>● Students must not loan or share personal device with others</li> </ul>
<b>Tips for Success:</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Clearly label all devices and power cords with your child's name</li> <li>● Set a password or passcode on the device</li> <li>● Bring devices to school fully charged and in good working order</li> <li>● Record the serial number and model information at home</li> <li>● Check homeowner's or renter's insurance policy to ensure coverage of lost or damaged personal technology devices</li> <li>● Students should power off, silence, or place devices on vibrate while working in class</li> </ul>	

<b>Appropriate Student Use:</b>					
<p>As with any resource, there are appropriate places and times for the use of devices on the Aldine Public Wi-Fi network. Below are the levels and permissible situations for use.</p> <p>Campus administrators and teachers have the right to prohibit use of devices at certain times or during designated activities that occur during the school day.</p> <p>However, the teacher may allow use of devices for instructional purposes.</p>
